1. Purpose.

The purpose of the Request for Proposal (“RFP”) issued in accordance with the requirements of Section 41-16-72(4), Code of Alabama (1975) by State Treasurer Kay Ivey (“Treasurer”) is to seek professional online and/or on-site auctioneering services (“Firm”) for the Unclaimed Property Division. These services are required to sell items of unclaimed property formerly held in safe deposit boxes and currently in custody as tangible personal property by the Unclaimed Property Division of the Office of State Treasurer. *The Treasurer reserves the right to reject any or all proposals and to solicit additional proposals if that is determined to be in the best interest of the State of Alabama.*

The Treasurer anticipates engaging a Firm to implement an auction in Calendar year 2009.

2. Background.

The Treasurer administers the Unclaimed Property program pursuant to Section 35-12-70 through 35-12-96, Code of Alabama (1975) (the “Code”). Businesses that are holding safe deposit box items and are unable to locate the rightful owners(s) of that property within statutorily defined periods, are required to report and deliver such property to the State Treasurer. Within three years after the receipt of the property and after attempting to find the rightful owner, the Treasurer is authorized to sell unclaimed tangible property to the highest bidder at a public sale. If the highest bid at public sale is insufficient in the judgment of the Treasurer, the highest bid may be declined and the property may be re-offered for sale at a later date. The property includes firearms, jewelry, coins, silverware, baseball cards, and similar items.

Pursuant to Section 35-12-80(d) of the Code, the purchaser of unclaimed property through an auction conducted by the Treasurer shall receive the property free of all claims, and will assume ownership of unclaimed property at the completion of the sale transaction.

This Request for Proposals (hereinafter “RFP”) is issued in accordance with the requirements of Section 41-16-72(4), Code of Alabama (1975). This RFP is not an offer to contract but seeks the submission of proposals from qualified, professional auctioneer firms that may form the basis for negotiation of a contract or agreement.

All property is to be sold “as is” and “where is”. The Treasurer does not make any warranty of any kind expressed or implied, as to the condition of the articles offered for sale. All sales are

final. All advertising materials must include this disclaimer. All transactions are between bidder and Auctioneer and will not involve the Treasurer or staff of the Office of Treasurer.

3. Proposal Required Information.

The Treasurer is seeking proposals for auctions services which comprise on-site auction events and/or online auction events/services. Therefore, this RFP is seeking qualified firms which adequately demonstrate and outline a proposal which specifically addresses the requirements and needs as outlined in this proposal request. Because the Auction industry offers a diversity between on-site auctions and online auctions, the Treasurer offers all firms an equal opportunity to submit complete proposals specific to either or both on-site auctions events or on-line auction events and services. In order to effectively evaluate proposals, each firm is required to prepare, delineate, and elaborate their services and proposal by separating work-plans and proposals between on-site or on-line auction events. Although, each firm has an opportunity to demonstrate its capabilities and interest by submitting plans on one or both type of auction formats, your firm must follow the required proposal format by separating the proposal, with details, between on-site auction and online auction.

To be considered, responses to this RFP must include the following:

- (1) Brief transmittal letter;
- (2) Exhibit A – Company Background
- (3) Exhibit B - Minimum Qualifications
- (4) Exhibit C – (Use for On-site Auction Only) Scope of Services, Operational Requirements, and Firm’s Work Plan Proposal
- (5) Exhibit D – (Use for Online or Internet Auction Only) Scope of Services, Operational Requirements, and Firm’s Work Plan Proposal
- (6) Exhibit E - Statement of Charges
- (7) Disclosure Statement. All proposals submitted in response to this RFP must include one original and completed Disclosure Statement as required by Section 41-16-80, et seq., Code of Alabama (1975). Copies of the Disclosure Statement, and information, may be downloaded from the Alabama Attorney General’s web site at www.ago.state.al.us/ag_items.cfm.

Submission Deadline: It is the responsibility of the Firm to ensure that its proposal is timely delivered and received in the Treasurer's Office on or before 5:00 p.m. on June 1, 2009. Provide an original proposal response plus two additional copies to facilitate our response evaluation process. Email an electronic copy of the response to alatreas@treasury.alabama.gov for retention purposes.

The Treasurer will not consider proposals received after the date and time specified herein. The Treasurer assumes no responsibility for late delivery by the U.S. Mail, the State's Central Mail Facility, a commercial courier service, or any other method of delivery selected by the Firm. The response may be emailed by the submission deadline with the paper documents delivered within two business days.

Questions and Inquiries: The sole point of contact for purposes of this RFP is Ralph Ainsworth, Unclaimed Property Director. Any questions or inquiries should be emailed to him at ralph.ainsworth@treasury.alabama.gov. All written questions should be submitted by May 28, 2009. Written responses to written questions and inquiries shall be posted on the Treasurer's website. Any oral communications shall be considered unofficial and nonbinding on Treasury and shall be strictly limited to questions from responders seeking clarification of the RFP.

Rejection of all Proposals: The Treasurer reserves the right to reject any or all proposals and/or to solicit additional proposals if that is determined to be fiscally advantageous to the State or otherwise in its best interests.

5. Evaluations and Selection

All proposals received will be reviewed and evaluated by a Selection Committee. The Committee will recommend proposals to the Treasurer that most closely meets the requirements of the RFP. The following will be used in making the selection.

- a. Offeror's Qualifications – Weight 25%
- b. Services offered, Workplan and Ability to Provide Services – Weight 25%
- c. Pricing – Weight 40%
- d. Creativity – Weight 5%
- e. Located in Alabama – Weight 5%

Treasurer will select the Firm the Treasurer determines, in her sole discretion, to be fully qualified and best suited among those submitting proposals on the basis of the evaluation factors,

including price, to best meet the needs of the owners of the property and the State of Alabama. It is the intent of the Treasurer to do business with Alabama firms that pay Alabama taxes and employ Alabama citizens. When all factors are equal, corporations located in Alabama will be given preference. *All proposals received in response to this RFP may be rejected and the Treasurer may solicit additional proposals.*

6. Agreement.

All duties of the Firm shall be set forth in a contract agreement between the vendor and the Treasurer. Constraints set by the Legislative Contract Review Committee determine that the contract be a two-year term, and may include a two-year extension. The contract will incorporate reference to the requirements of the RFP and the vendor's proposal as negotiated.

State law prohibits the Board from agreeing to (1) indemnify the firm; (2) waive the right for jury trial; (3) grant a security interest; or (4) binding arbitration. Additionally, it is mandatory that Alabama laws apply to the performance of the contract and that jurisdiction and venue be in Montgomery, Alabama for State and Federal courts.

The Treasurer shall post the RFP and the notice of award on the treasury website www.treasury.alabama.gov. It is expected that the award notice shall be posted within two (2) weeks following June 1, 2009, and will remain posted for at least two weeks.

7. Efforts to Influence Selection Process Prohibited

The integrity of the RFP process is of primary importance and will not be compromised. Any written or oral communications beyond the RFP response made by responders, or others on their behalf, whether paid or unpaid, to influence the selection process, from the time the RFP is issued through its conclusion, made directly or indirectly to the Treasurer or Treasury staff will be grounds for immediate elimination from the selection process.

8. Public Information.

All responses received will be subject to the Alabama Open Records Act, §36-12-40, Code of Alabama and may be subject to public disclosure upon request. The Open Records Act is remedial and should therefore be liberally construed in favor of the public. The Alabama Trade Secrets Act is §8-27-1 through §8-27-6, Code of Alabama. Responders are cautioned to be familiar with these statutes. The burden is on the one asserting the trade secret to show that the information sought to be protected meets the definition of a Trade Secret as defined in the Act.

Any RFP response submitted that contains confidential, trade secrets or proprietary commercial information must be conspicuously marked on the outside as containing confidential information, and each page upon which confidential information appears must be conspicuously marked as such. Identification of the entire bid proposal as confidential is not acceptable unless the Firm enumerates the specific grounds or applicable laws, which support treatment of the entire material as, protected from disclosure according to the foregoing statutes or other applicable Alabama law.

The owner of the confidential information shall indemnify and hold the State of Alabama, the ATF Board, and staff harmless from all costs or expenses, including but not limited to attorney fees and expenses related to litigation concerning disclosure of said information and documents.

- A. The Auctioneer has been providing comprehensive auctioneer services as described in Scope of Services for at least three previous calendar years from current year.

The amount of the bond shall not be less than one hundred twenty five percent (125%) of the maximum estimated value of all property to be held and sold by Auctioneer.

Scope of Services, Operational Requirements And Firm's Work Plan Proposal

(Use only for On-site Auction Proposals)

Scope of Services and Operational Requirements – On-site Auction Proposal

Proposals are sought to provide comprehensive auction services to the Treasurer, including:

1. all labor, materials, sound system, display cases, etc. necessary for setup, preview, auction and dismantle for on-site auction;
2. all arrangements for an on-site auction;
3. transportation of items to be sold at the public auction to and from the auction location (if applicable);
4. all advertisement expenses, creation, and placement related to the preview and auction, including but not limited to auction catalog, newspapers, trade publication, radio and television. All advertisement to be approved by the Treasurer;
5. providing security personnel while items are in the possession of the Auctioneer, including but not limited to, during transportation, setup, preview and auction;
6. collecting and accepting payments from successful bidders, and determining forms of payment that will be accepted;
7. accounting/settlement report providing for each lot, at a minimum, the sale lot number and associated Treasury packet number, description of item, bidder number of successful bidder, actual sale price, and net proceeds.
8. final accounting report of total auction proceeds and number of bidders;
9. responsibility and custody of all auctionable items prior the auction at a time agreed upon between the Auctioneer and the Treasurer;
10. devising a method for handling disputes;
11. bonding or insurance as described in Exhibit B – Minimum Qualifications;
12. Ability, mechanism, and plan to conduct appraisals on property items, prior to offering to auction;
13. serving as auctioneer.

Stipulations in Auctioning Unclaimed Property Inventory

In preparing the proposal and work plan, the Firm should keep in mind that property items as provided in Attachment 1 (as a sample) will be required to be held, sold, and tracked by "Packet Numbers". The integrity of the property, transaction, and sale proceeds must remain intact with accountability to each packet number. Co-mingling property items between packet numbers is discouraged in an effort to accurately account and document ownership proceeds, which is reflected solely by the individual packet numbers. Although, the Treasurer encourages the Firm to consider and propose an accurate and equitable means of combining packets, given the Firm's expertise in the Auction industry.

Scope of Services and Operational Requirements – Online or Internet Auction Proposal

On the Treasurer's behalf, Contractor shall contract with eBay or a competitive online auction vehicle to set up an eBay account, that allows payment methods approved by the Treasurer, and maintain an auction page/store to post items for sale. The name of the account shall be approved by the Treasurer prior to final adoption. Items may be added to this listing at the sole discretion of the Treasurer. A sample of items to be auctioned is included as Attachment 1.

Prior to the auction(s), the Contractor shall be responsible for both cost and logistical provisions necessary to pick up items for sale from the Treasurer's office. The Contractor shall be responsible for the secured transportation of said items to their storage location. Contractor is required to have sufficient secured space to safely store and manage items.

The Firm should discuss this process with detail in the "Methodology, Work Plan, and Timeline" section as part of this Exhibit D.

- A. Contractor shall be responsible for the creation of photographs and descriptive text and the posting of items for online sale.
- B. Contractor shall ship the items to the successful bidder. Contractor shall assume all liability and shall insure all property placed in its custody by the Treasurer during the period of time it is in Contractor's custody; including transporting items to the Contractor's location. Prior to Treasurer releasing any items to the Contractor, Contractor shall provide evidence to the Treasurer that it has sufficient insurance protection to cover the items to be released by Treasurer and associated casualty and liability coverage. Insurance sufficient to cover items should be an amount sufficient to cover total loss or destruction of all items.
- C. Demonstrate and establish the capability and plan for an adequate system to manage inventory from the Treasurer.
- D. Contractor shall be required to review all eBay or online company policies, procedures, licensing agreements and user agreements to advise the Treasurer on any potential issues with selling its items in this online environment. In the event that Contractor determines that an item is ineligible for sale online, they shall notify the Treasurer and suggest options and alternatives specific to the ineligibility of the tangible item(s).

- E. Upon successful completion of the weekly online sales, Contractor shall provide an electronic file to the Treasurer listing gross sale prices, detailed charges for each property item, and any property coding required by the Treasurer to match proceeds back to original owner records. Said file must be in a format compatible and usable by the Treasurer's computer systems and operations.
- F. While the desire is to sell to the highest bidder, Treasurer shall reserve the right to set minimum bid requirements and refuse bids deemed inadequate.
- G. Settled items shall be removed from the online auctionable list on the day the auction ends.
- H. Proposals are sought to provide comprehensive online auction services to the Treasurer, which includes:
 - 1. all labor, materials, technology, and online service requirements necessary to setup, preview, and auction items specific to an on-site auction;
 - 2. all other arrangements necessary to conduct an on-line auction, if applicable;
 - 3. transportation and storage of items to be sold;
 - 4. all advertisement expenses, creation, and placement related to the preview and auction, including but not limited to auction catalog, newspapers, trade publication, radio and television. All advertisement to be approved by the Treasurer;
 - 5. providing security while items are in the possession of the Auctioneer;
 - 6. collecting and accepting payments from successful bidders, and determining forms of payment that will be accepted;
 - 7. accounting/settlement report providing for each lot, at a minimum, the sale lot number and associated Treasury packet number, description of item, bidder number of successful bidder, actual sale price, and net proceeds for each property item.
 - 8. final accounting report of total auction proceeds and number of bidders;
 - 9. responsibility and custody of all auctionable items prior to the auction at a time agreed upon between the Auctioneer and the Treasurer;
 - 10. devising a method for handling disputes;
 - 11. bonding or insurance as described in Exhibit B – Minimum Qualifications;
 - 12. Ability, mechanism, and plan to conduct appraisals on property items, prior to offering to auction;

EXHIBIT E

Statement of Charges

Proposals should state whether the firm is submitting a “Statement of Charges” for on-site auction services or online auction services. If your Firm is submitting proposals for both, on-site auctions and online auctions, you must develop a separate Exhibit E for each. Do not combine fees between on-site and online auction proposals.

FEES

Provide your price for auction services described in this RFP as a percentage of the gross proceeds from the public auction of the items. The Auctioneer may elect to charge a Bidder’s Premium in addition to or in lieu of the stated percentage of the gross proceeds. All compensation issues must be included as this will be the sole compensation paid to the Auctioneer.

The Auctioneer will receive all sale proceeds, and will be responsible for deducting the approved contract fee and making final settlement and payment to the Treasurer. Final payment should be made within five (5) business days following the auction.
